
## JULY ADVENTURES



# MASONVILLE COVE SITE MAP



#### **EDUCATION CENTER**

- Sign in at station near door
- Building and bathrooms are CLOSED TO THE PUBLIC due to Covid19 precautions
- Check out the amazing views of the Cove from the back deck

#### VERNAL POOL TRAIL

- Entire loop is about 0.07 miles
- A very easy-to-walk trail
- Great spot to view birds

#### STREAMSIDE TRAIL

- About 0.1 miles
- Trail leads out to the waterfront and great views of Captain Trash Wheel

#### CAPTAIN'S LOOKOUT

 A great spot to catch a shot of Captain Trash Wheel

#### DRIFTWOOD TRAIL

- About 0.16 miles to the piers
- Entire loop (Driftwood Trail and Access Road) is about 0.31 miles
- Trail winds through beautiful restored meadows

#### WATERFRONT PIER

• Enjoy fantastic views of Baltimore
